A Message From Our Pastor...

Exciting New Year ahead of you and me.

"Hey, Pastor Cho! Any new things happening at FGUMC?" Often I receive this question when I am visiting parishioners, especially with the FGUMC homebound. "Any new and exciting news to share?" I am thank-ful for their question, for it shows they do have a great interest in the ministry of Jesus Christ at Fairfield Grace.

Below is my answer. A half dozen wonderful ministries are expected to happen this coming new year, 2015. Let me list them one by one. See which one or two of them you find interesting, exciting and challenging.

First of all, a program called "Encountering Other Faiths" will begin this month and last until May. Hinduism, Buddhism, Islam and Judaism are four major religions we will study monthly, with the exception of the Lenten season in March. Come to Hood Parlor on Sundays at 9 am or on Wednesdays at 10:10am, and you will be glad to take part in this learning and growing opportunity. Visiting their temples and meeting them are part of the program in which you and your family are invited to participate. We are going to a Hindu temple in Wilton, CT, on Sunday, Jan. 25, a Buddhist temple either in West Hartford, CT, or upstate in New York, on Sunday, Feb. 8, a mosque in Bridgeport, CT, on Sunday, April 26, and lastly a Jewish temple in Bridgeport, CT, on Sunday, May 17. I am excited about this new and eye-opening experience available to us. I hope we find who we are more clearly by learning who they are. I know our faith as Christians will be strengthened when we know more about other faiths and their practices.

Beginning in January, FGUMC Coffee House will be open every Thursday morning at 10:10 am in Tremayne Hall. Yes, it is a time and place to meet and chat with one another and even play games. Learn more about the Coffee House by reading an article by Wayne Brown in this month's Quester. Do you feel like coming out of the house and meeting sisters and/or brothers in Christ and having a good and meaningful time with Pastor J and Pastor Cho? Then come to the church every Thursday morning. Be informed that the first Thursday morning is reserved for the Retired Men's Group and the second Thursday morning for women only. The third and fourth Thursday mornings are open for all, women and men. Bring with you any activity ideas you would like to have implemented during our time at the Coffee House.

Thirdly, our youth ministry has been running wonderfully lately, thanks to our proud youth director, Lauren, and all the faithful and energetic members of the Youth Advisory Board. Beginning this month, one or two youth will serve as a worship leader every second Sunday, which has been known as Youth/Hymn Sing Sunday at FGUMC. They will lead us in observing the Soup-er Bowl Sunday on Feb. 1, collecting a can food or one dollar for the poor and the hungry. Ski Trip/Winter Retreat has been planned for Feb 20-22, Friday through Sunday. I gladly accepted the invitation to take part in this retreat. I am looking forward to spending time with our youth. Again in April, they will do the Midnight Run on Holy Maundy Thursday, April 2. It is a great joy to see more and more youth coming and enjoying time spent with one another at FGUMC, a safe, secure and fun-filled place. Yes, we are here to support them and help them enjoy their journey with us.

This is a time to meditate, relax, reflect, and pray in a quiet and peaceful setting, where you can be with God in moments of silence.



Paper Shredding Day–Saturday May 16, 2015

Do you ever want to clean out your files of old bank statements, checks, brokerage statements, income tax forms, etc.? There are a lot of papers that you should put through a shredder so no one will use the information for identity theft. You may even have a small office shredder at home. But there are times when you have so much to shred that it would take you hours with a small shredder. So the job just does not get done.

Pastor Cho has made changes for the 10 a.m. Thursday morning get-togethers at Fairfield Grace Church. Originally these were held the first Thursday of each month for retired men, but now meetings are being scheduled for both men and women parishioners.

Starting the new year, this is the new schedule:

Jan. 1 – On New Year's Day there will be no meeting.

Jan. 8 – Retired Men's meeting. (Usually held first Thursday.)

Jan. 15 – Coffee House for women only. (Usually held second Thursday.)

Jan. 22 – Coffee House for men and women.




Newcomers will find the Thursday Coffee House is informal, stimulating, often surprising, and a good place to develop new friendships.
