

Please keep all the delegates in your prayers, so that they may be guided and directed by the power of the Holy Spirit to move forward to "making disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world." While I am away, Rev. David Piscatelli, pastor of Nichols UMC, will be on call to meet your pastoral needs. And Pastor J and Rev. Cass Shaw, President and CEO of the Council of Churches of Greater Bridgeport, Inc., will preach on May 15 and May 22, respectively.

Lastly but not least, the celebration of our 60th anniversary is scheduled to be held next month on Sunday, June 19. #### Why are there different colored altar cloths?

Have you ever wondered why the colors of the altar cloths change?

The Christian year has two cycles: the Christmas cycle (Advent-Christmas-Epiphany) and the Easter cycle (Lent-Easter-Pentecost).

- ~Advent and Lent: purple represents royalty and penitence.
- ~Advent: blue symbolizes hope and can also be used during Advent.
- ~Christmas and Easter: white and gold are used to symbolize joy and festivities.
- ~Red symbolizes the color of fire to represent the Holy Spirit on the day of Pentecost. During Holy Week it represents the blood of Christ.
- ~Green represents growth and is used the season after Epiphany and the season after Pentecost.
